Greetings Sir Knights,

The election season is now past, we have a vaccine for COVID-19, the year 2020 is over and we can see a light at the end of the tunnel -- we just don't know how long the tunnel is! - There are 12 angels guarding the 12 heavenly gates (Revelation 21:12).
- Why was the Christian calendar divided into 12 months?
- Why are there **12** inches in a foot measurement?
- Why are there 12 major scales in music? Is music a universal language?
- Why are there 12 buttons on the front of a Templar Dress uniform coat?
- Why did the ancient Sumerians group the stars into 12 Zodiac constellations (known as The Pantheon of Twelve)?
