Our new Right Eminent Grand Commander, Sir Knight Arthur William Stauff, K.T.C.H., is the scion of a multigenerational Masonic Family. He started his journey in Doric Chapter, Order of DeMolay, where he served as Master Councilor in 1976 and as State Master Councilor of Connecticut DeMolay in 1979. He was raised in Continental Lodge No. 76, A.F. & A.M. in Waterbury, Connecticut, three years later. He continues his service to DeMolay, having received the Distinguished Service Award, Degree of Chevalier, Cross of Honor, and Legion of Honor. He is a member of New Hampshire Preceptory, DeMolay Legion of Honor, and is the Executive Officer for New Hampshire and an Active Member of the International Supreme Council of the Order of DeMolay. He began his York Rite journey in Gainesville Chapter No. 2, Royal Arch Masons, Gainesville Council No. 27, Royal and Select Masters, and Pilgrim

Commandery No. 7, Knights Templar, all in Gainesville, Florida, on December 8, 1984.



Sir Knight Stauff enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1980. He entered the University of Florida on a Naval **R.O.T.C. Scholarship, graduating with B.S. degree in Business Management and an Ensign's** commission in 1985. He served thirty-four years in the U.S. Navy, retiring in 2014 with the rank of Captain and having received twenty-four decorations for his service. He continued his education, earning Master's degrees in Industrial Technology from Central Connecticut State University, Naval Operations from the U.S. Naval War College, and Joint Military Planning from the Joint Force Staff College of the National Defense Institute. Until recently, he was the Instructor of Naval Science in the N.J.R.O.T.C. Program at Manchester West High School. He is a member of the Naval Order of the United States and the Association of the U.S. Navy.

Sir Knight Stauff is a Past Master of Liberty-Continental Lodge No. 76, Waterbury, Connecticut, and holds membership in Solomon Lodge No. 822, Ludwigsburg, Germany, and Washington Lodge No. 61, Manchester. He is affiliated with the Scottish Rite Valley of Concord, A.A.S.R., N.M.J. Upon moving to New Hampshire, he affiliated with the Manchester York Rite Bodies where he served as High Priest of Mt. Horeb Chapter No. 11 in 2017, Illustrious Master of Adoniram Council No. 3 in 2021, and Eminent Commander of Trinity Commandery No. 1 in 2018.
