



HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE UPDATE

The Grand Commandery is now offering, for a donation to the Texas Holy Land Pilgrimage Foundation, a Holy Land Pilgrimage Badge. The design bears Texas in the center either bronze, silver, or gold to denote the value of the contribution:



- Bronze Crosses in each quadrant \$250 donation
- Silver Crosses in each quadrant \$500 donation
- Gold Crosses in each quadrant \$1000 donation

This Badge may be worn by contributing Sir Knight purchasing the same as a part of his Templar Uniform. It may be worn on the left side of the uniform above the pocket and the name tag and veterans ribbon, if applicable. The first 100 Sir Knights to purchase a full badge shall receive a sequentially numbered badge, which shall designate them as one of the Charter Donors. The Holy Land Pilgrimage Badge may be worn on All Texas Templar Uniforms except the cap and mantle.



A MESSAGE FROM THE EMINENT GRAND PRELATE SK BRAD BILLINGS, KCT

Have you ever experienced a setback or obstacle in your life? It is almost a rhetorical question as anyone who has minute experience in life will have certainly suffered what they perceive to be a setback. We've all had difficult times in our lives whether it be a personal struggle, professional obstacle or simply having to deal with a circumstance beyond our control.

Adversity is a universal experience that touches each of our lives at different times and in different ways and, while adversity is never fun to deal with, it can lead us to the next chapter of our story as it presents us with an obstacle to overcome by growth, resilience or transformation.

Remember the story of Joseph, the baby of the family; the twelfth and favorite son of Jacob.
