Sixty years ago this month witnessed two formative events in my life. First, my beloved San Francisco Giants won the National League Pennant, defeating the despised Los Angeles Dodgers in a three-game playoff. They would lose the World Series to the New York Yankees in a heart-breaking seventh game, when Bobby Richardson snared Willy McCovey's line drive with two outs in the bottom of the ninth and the potential winning run on second base, in the person of one Willy Mays. Forty-eight years would pass before I saw them finally crowned World Series Champions.

The drama in Candlestick Park would be eclipsed by events unfolding some 2,600 miles away, in Cuba, when on the 16th of the month, the Soviet Union was discovered preparing to deploy Intermediate Range Ballistic Missiles there, which would be able to strike the United States within minutes. At the time, my father, Sir Knight George X. Tsirimokos (Bavaria Commandery No. 3, Munich, Germany), was a Major and radar navigator in the Strategic Air Command, flying the B-52 Stratofortress out of Travis Air Force Base, California with the 5th Bomb Wing's 23rd Bomb Squadron. Over the next several weeks, he and his crew flew airborne alert, awaiting the dreaded "Go Code" which happily never came. Cooler heads
