PGC Keith Gates established the Holy land Pilgrimage medal endowment fund as an integral part of our completely new Constitution approved in 2019. We need to promote that endowment fund so that we can build our foundation that helps send an ordained minister to the holy land every year. The goal is to have liquid funds available when the Recorder needs it at the least risk of loss of principle. It has been an honor to serve my brothers in the Grand Commandry as Treasurer. Whenever, Brother Glen Girard, is ready to take over the function of Treasurer, whether this year or next, you can all be assured a True and Trusty Brother will be watching your money
